What is Krav Maga?

- Who Is Darren Levine?
 - o Chief Instructor of Krav Maga Worldwide
 - Started practicing martial arts at the age of 12
 - Participated in the first instructor course for Krav Maga offered to civilians for people outside the state of Israel
 - o Mentored by the grandmaster of Krav Maga, Imi Lichtenfeld
 - Works as a senior prosecutor for the largest prosecutorial agency in the world
- Who Is Jon Pascal?
 - Director of Krav Maga Force Training Division
 - Exposed to Krav Maga 30 years ago
 - Became a peace officer 18 years ago
 - Passionate about sharing the Krav Maga program with law enforcement, military, and security operators worldwide

The Roots of the System

- Imi Lichtenfeld
 - Imi Lichtenfeld was the founder of Krav Maga
 - He was a natural athlete winning championships in multiple sports
 - o Imi had an innate understanding of body movement and was gifted teacher
 - Imi's greatest influence was his father, Samuel, a police officer and self-defense instructor
- Samuel Lichtenfeld
 - Samuel started as a circus acrobat and wrestler, but later entered the police department and served for 30 years as chief detective inspector
 - He became well-known for his impressive arrest record, particularly his capture of dangerous criminals
 - o Samuel also taught self-defense techniques at the gym he owned
 - In training, Samuel constantly emphasized the need for proper moral conduct in dealing with the public and with suspects

Introduction to Krav Maga

- Settling in Israel
 - After years of travel, Imi settled in Israel, which was then called Palestine, and he joined the Haganah
 - The Haganah was a paramilitary organization fighting for Jewish independence
 - o He taught soldiers basic hand-to-hand fighting skills
 - o In 1948 the State of Israel was born
 - The Israeli government asked Imi to develop an effective fighting system which became known as Krav Maga
 - o Imi became the chief instructor for physical training and Krav Maga
- Constant State of War
 - From its start the State of Israel was at war
 - Israel turned to Imi to develop a set of combat techniques that were easy to learn, easy to remember, and easy to perform
 - The combat system had to apply to people of all ages and size
 - Imi based his self-defense system on the body's natural movements and instincts
 - Another element Imi added to Krav Maga was aggressiveness and a "never quit" attitude

The History of Krav Maga in the United States

- Translating to Civilians
 - Imi wanted the same lifesaving skills that his combat system provided to the military to apply to citizens as well
 - o Eventually Krav Maga began to spread to civilians and law enforcement
 - In 1981 the Krav Maga Association of Israel and the Ministry of Education held the first International Instructor's Course for Krav Maga
 - o Daniel Abraham wanted to help spread Krav Maga to civilians around the world
- Darren and Imi
 - During the course Darren and Imi became friends
 - o Imi promised Darren that he would visit him in the United States
 - True to his word Imi traveled to Los Angeles and lived with Darren and his family while teaching Darren more about Krav Maga



Introduction to Krav Maga

- It Needs to Be Simple and Effective
 - o Krav Maga is so focused on remaining practical and effective thanks to Imi
 - Imi always searched for ways to do things in the most simple way possible
 - He believed that something must be simple in order for people to do it
 - Imi knew that the more simple you kept things the more it would work to the benefit of safety
- Darren's Journey
 - Darren's mother allowed for a Krav Maga class to be taught after school to parents
 - Due to the program's popularity the parents demanded Krav Maga be taught to their children
 - Children who learned Krav Maga became more calm, confident, secure, and focused in their academic learning
 - From there Krav Maga began to spread
 - Krav Maga became so popular that an instructor and licensing program was created
 - Krav Maga effectively answered the need of personal safety

- Krav Maga in the World Today
 - Krav Maga saves lives
 - o Krav Maga is being taught officially in over 500 law enforcement agencies
 - Krav Maga is being taught in hundreds of Krav Maga Worldwide schools across the world
